Information Technology (IT) Schedule 70 General Services Administration (GSA)

Contract Number: GS-35F-0343J

Under the GSA Schedules (also referred to as Multiple Award Schedules (MAS) and Federal Supply Schedules (FSS)) Program, GSA establishes long-term Government-wide contracts with commercial firms to provide access to millions of commercial supplies (products) and services that can be ordered directly from GSA Schedule contractors, through the GSA Advantage!® online shopping and ordering system, or through GSA eBuy, an electronic Request for Quote (RFQ)/Request for Proposal (RFP) system designed to allow federal buyers to request information, find sources and prepare RFQs/RFPs online. The GSA Schedule Program is governed under Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Subpart 8.4.

Each GSA Schedule is composed of Special Item Numbers (SINs), which is a categorization method that groups similar products, services, and solutions together to aid in the acquisition process. Schedules are Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contracts that provide for an indefinite quantity of supplies and services during a fixed period of time. They help streamline the contract process and speed service delivery. Customers contract with pre-approved vendors and benefit from “most-favored customer” pricing with GSA Schedules. Customers who order from Schedules realize: savings; flexibility and choice; shorter lead time; transparency; control of the procurement; lower administrative costs; and reduced inventories.

The GSA Information Technology (IT) Schedule 70 is the largest, most widely used IT procurement vehicle that offers a comprehensive array of state-of-the-art IT products, services, and solutions. While the contract is negotiated by the General Services Administration (GSA), federal, state, and local government agencies can use the GSA Schedule 70 to purchase IT solutions.

132-32: Term Software License - Includes operating system software, application software, EDI translation and mapping software, enabled E-mail message based products, Internet software, database management programs, and other software. Software maintenance as a product includes the publishing of bug/defect fixes via patches and updates/upgrades in function and technology to maintain the operability and usability of the software product. It may also include other no charge support that is included in the purchase price of the product in the commercial marketplace.

132-51 Information Technology Professional Services - SUBJECT TO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING - Includes resources and facilities management, database planning and design, systems analysis and design, network services, programming, millennium conversion services, conversion and implementation support, network services project management, data/records management, subscriptions/publications (electronic media), and other services.

132-62 Homeland Security Presidential Directive 12 (HSPD-12) Product and Service Components - Products and services for agencies to implement the requirements of HSPD-12, FIPS-201 and associated National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) special publications. Features and Benefits of the Schedule

GSA has streamlined the GSA procurement process. GSA Schedule 70 is one of the most flexible vehicles for purchasing information technology products and services.

- **Lower Fees** - Lower Fees-GSA applies a 0.75% Industrial Funding Fee to every schedule purchase order as compensation for administrative costs. The fee is included in the labor rates. There is no fee on Other Direct costs (ODCs).
- **Shorter Lead Times** - No RFPs are required. No synopsis is required. Customers are encouraged to keep justification to a minimum. Delivery orders can be executed within a matter of days.
- **Simplified Ordering Procedures** - Per FAR 8.404, it is not necessary to seek further competition, synopsise the requirement, make a separate determination of fair and reasonable pricing, or consider small business set-asides.
- **Reduced Paperwork** - Per FAR 8.404, agencies are encouraged to keep documentation to a minimum. For orders of \$2,500 or less, identify the contractor, the item, and the amount paid. For orders of more than \$2,500, document in accordance with internal agency practices.
- **No Maximum Order Limitation** - There is no ceiling on order size. The "maximum order" level of \$500,000 is a threshold for seeking a price reduction.
- **Blanket Purchase Agreements** - Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs) allow customers and contractors to set up on-going accounts to fill recurring requirements. There is no dollar limitation.
- **Teaming Arrangements Contractor** - Team Arrangements can be used to provide total solutions to customer requirements. Under a Contractor Team Arrangement, GSA schedule contractors can respond to agency requirements as a team, proposing line items from one or more schedule contracts on a single purchase order. One contractor acts as the team leader to coordinate the line items. Contractor Team Arrangements may be used in conjunction with BPAs. In addition, subcontractors can be easily added to a schedule contractor.
